### COMMUNITY

Farmington Area Public Schools (District 192) is a growing school district located in the southern suburbs of the Twin Cities. The district has a long and proud history that is deeply rooted in the community it serves. As that community has changed from rural to predominately suburban, Farmington area schools have changed to meet those new needs while maintaining a connection to their agricultural past. District 192 includes all of the city of Farmington, as well as a portion of Lakeville and several surrounding townships. Total population within the district has exceeded 33,000. Student population is more than 6,900 and is expected to remain stable over the next five years.

**FACILITY**

The district's newest facility, Farmington High School, opened its doors to over 1,700 students in the fall of 2009, and welcomed 9th graders back to the high school for the first time in 10 years. With a capacity of 2,000+ students and nearly 500,000 square feet of interior instructional, athletic, and fine arts performance space, FHS incorporates some of the latest school-design features in an eco-friendly, light-filled instructional environment that serves as a learning and amenity rich environment for students, parents, and community members alike.



The Farmington Independent School District recognizes the value and importance of athletics programs as an extension of a comprehensive educational program. It contributes to the mental and physical well being of our students. The FHS Athletics Department offers 30 varsity-level athletics programs as well as numerous junior varsity, B-squad, and 9<sup>th</sup> Grade athletics program offerings. FHS is a member of the Missota Conference and also a member of the Minnesota High School League and Region 1AA.

**CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES**

Over fifteen co-curricular activities and clubs are offered at the high school. Leadership, academic, and fine arts are all included in the wide variety of programs offered, including: Link Crew, Tiger Leadership Club, Diversity Club, National Honor Society, Student Council, Youth Development, BPA, FCCLA, Mock Trial, Speech Club, One Act Play, Spring Musical, Robotics, Marching Band, Peers for Peers, FFA, and Yearbook.

**CURRICULUM**

Farmington High School students benefit from extensive curricular offerings of over 200 courses in more than 13 different areas of study. The comprehensive curriculum at FHS aligns with state and national standards while emphasizing post-secondary planning and readiness through a full range of college preparatory classes, as well as career and technical courses. FHS partners with local and regional colleges and universities to further broaden student opportunity and choice. All of these curricular elements support the Farmington district goal of providing customized learning experiences to each student through choice and the use of technology to enhance and advance learning and instruction.

There are numerous opportunities for students to earn college credit while at FHS. College level programs include: Advanced Placement (AP), College in the Schools (CIS) through the University of Minnesota, Senior to Sophomore (S2S) through St. Cloud State University, Post-Secondary Enrollment Option (PSEO), and Articulation Agreements, both local and regional. **GRADING**

Grade Point Averages (GPA) are calculated using the quality points listed below. Beginning in grade nine, all courses, whether passed or failed, are included in the GPA calculation. Please note that only AP, CIS, and SCSU courses are weighted using a 1.2 multiplier. The grading scale is as follows:

- A = 4.0    B+ = 3.333    B- = 2.667    C = 2.0    D+ = 1.333    D- = .667
- A- = 3.667    B = 3.0    C+ = 2.333    C- = 1.667    D = 1.0    F = 0.0

**CREDITS AND GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS**

The FHS school day runs on five 60-minute class periods with three trimesters per year. Each successfully completed class equals one credit, so each student has the opportunity to receive fifteen credits per year. To complete a year-long curriculum, a student must complete two trimesters of a subject (i.e. Biology A and Biology B). SCSU classes are two trimesters in length. AP and CIS classes are three trimesters in length.

FHS Graduation Requirements:

Students must satisfactorily complete 55 credits. Credit distribution is as follows:
